Core elements of this methodological training:

- Why is hunger still a global problem despite the growing amount of produced food?
- What is the future of agriculture in a post-oil world?
- How can we have a say in what we eat and how it is produced?

Food is one of the most basic irrevocable needs of every living being. Yet for decades its production has been increasingly guided by profits and technological efficiency, with complete disregard to the environment and the needs of the people at both ends of the production chain. The number of farmers is rapidly declining, farming has become ever dependant on petrochemicals and growing supply chains have separated producers from consumers. Fed up with this reality, many actors around the globe are experimenting with alternative approaches.

During this workshop we will explore the problems of contemporary agriculture and reformative proposals such as the food sovereignty movement, peasant agroecology, permaculture, community supported agriculture and the initiative "People's Food Policy". The focus of this training lies on experimenting with interactive, participatory methods. We will reflect upon and exchange about the best on the best educational practices to work with food-related topics in the context of education for sustainable development. A study visit to a local farm is also part of the program.

Is this the right training for me?

This training is suitable for you, if you would like to ...

- learn new thematic methods and approaches from Education for Sustainable Development (ESD), transformative education and degrowth education, and adjust them to the needs of your own work/volunteering
- deepen your understanding of sustainable agriculture, food sovereignty and global food supply
- reconsider your own role as multiplier and learning companion
- engage in fruitful peer-exchange with colleagues from the fields of both formal and non-formal education
- become part of a growing network of multipliers in the field in Germany and Poland

Practical details:

- **Costs:** The participation fee has a solidary structure: 60-100 EUR for participants living in Germany, 100-200 PLN for participants living in Poland (incl. accommodation, meals and program).
- **Language:** The main seminar language is English. If needed, translation from/to German and Polish can be provided.
- **Registration:** The registration form is available on www.kreisau.de. Registrations are open till May 5 and valid after confirmation by e-mail.
- **Recognition:** The training is recognized as educational leave in Berlin according to § 11 BiUrlG. Additional recognitions might be obtained upon request.

To support the implementation of potential actions inspired by the seminar, participants are invited to attend at least two training modules in the project timeframe (2018-2020).
